

Oregon Auditions: Three Advance to Seattle

On Sunday, October 8th, while the Portland Marathon was in progress, 16 talented young operatic singers participated in the Oregon Auditions. which took place inside PSU's wonderful Lincoln Performance Hall. Instead of the usual one or two piano accompanists, there were several at this year's event: all were stellar! Former standout opera stars, Elizabeth Hynes and Cynthia Munzer, were joined by the Director of the Houston Grand Opera (HGO) Studio, Brian Speck, as judges. The trio of judges plays a huge role in the competitive process, not only selecting the prize-winners, but assigning each singer a second aria to perform after each begins with an aria of their own choice.

Three female singers: two sopranos, **Cara Gabrielson** and **Jasmin White**, and a mezzo-soprano, **Anne Maguire**, were selected to advance to the next round of the competition, on Sunday, March 4, 2018 (Cont. p. 2)

Ms. Maguire actually competed here in 2014, and was the only singer to advance from Seattle, going on to the Semi-Final round in New York in 2015. Ms. White was selected as the Marilyn Crilley Audience Favorite which earned her additional prize money. Yet another soprano received an "Encouragement Award" by the judges; this was **Brooklyn Snow**. Two incoming Portland Opera Resident Artists, soprano Helen Zhibing Huang and bass Shi Li entered these Auditions and performed admirably. Opera lovers in Portland are in store for some wonderful singing as we watch these two develop over the next couple of years.

Professor, and Director of PSU's Opera Program, Christine Meadows, a superb mezzo in her own right, served as an appropriate and laudable hostess for the afternoon's program. While the judges were deliberating, Professor Meadows introduced local music-maker, Michael Alan Harrison, who is in the process of writing an opera about Pinocchio, to the audience. Harrison delighted all by detailing his approach to the opera and playing excerpts on the piano.

Of course, the Oregon Auditions could not take place without the efforts of *District Director*, **Jutta Allen.** Jutta and her Committee of Volunteers see to it that the entire day runs smoothly. Jutta - thank you for yet another year of service to the Portland opera community!

Feb. 10: **Donizetti's L'elisir D'amore** – South African soprano **Pretty Yende** debuts as Adina opposite Matthew Polenzani's Nemorino.

Feb. 24: **Puccini's La Boheme** – Sonya Yoncheva, Sussana Phillips, and Michael Fabiano lead the cast in perhaps the world's favorite opera.

March 21: **Rossini's** *Semiramide* – A masterpiece of dazzling vocal fireworks making a rare Met appearance with local favorite diva, **Angela Meade** leading a stellar *bel canto* cast.

Meet Portland Opera's Resident Artists for 2018



Mezzo-soprano, **Kate Farrar** will remain for her second Resident Artist season and the three newcomers are tenor, **Thomas Cilluffo**, soprano, **Helen Huang**, and bass-baritone, **Shi Li**.

Mr. Cilluffo recently completed an MM in Voice Performance at the University of Michigan where he studied under Professor George Shirley, who sang for several seasons with the Metropolitan Opera and around the world. Cilluffo sang Tamino in a recent Portland Opera -to-go (POGO) production of Mozart's *The Magic Flute*.

Ms. Huang holds a Graduate Diploma from the New England Conservatory and is a graduate of soprano Dawn Upshaw's Bard Vocal Arts Program. In addition, she graduated from the Eastman School of Music with a BM in Vocal Performance and the University of Rochester with a BA in Economics. A firm believer of Music as an aid for Social Causes, Ms. Huang is co-founder of Voices of the East, a musical collective that promotes and advocates young Asian and Asian-American musicians' voices in the contemporary classical music world.

Shi Li comes to us from Harbin, China. He is the recipient of a BA from the Shanghai Conservatory of Music and earned a MM and Professional Study from the Manhattan School of Music. Mr. Li won numerous singing competitions in China and sang with several Symphonies there.

Ms. Farrar, you might recall, is a North Carolina native who won an MONC Competition in that state in 2014. No one who saw her superb **Dorabella** in last season's *Cosi* will ever forget it! Before coming to Portland, Ms. Farrar was an "apprentice artist" with Sarasota Opera Company. We look forward to hearing each of these young singers in the 2018 Portland Opera Season and in recital at Portland Art Museum.
